


This coming Lord's Day, May 17th, is the Sixth Sunday in the Easter Season. It is also listed as *Mission Worker Sunday* on our Presbyterian Church (USA) Planning Calendar. There was a time when congregations would have a Missionary, who was home on furlough, come and give a presentation on their efforts in the Mission Field. Technology has made it possible for people to communicate mission work to a far greater audience. You can search the National P.C. (USA) website for information at www.pcusa.org and see what communications they have to offer. Nevertheless, we would do well to remember the men and women who have felt the call to the Mission Fields as we worship. They are grateful for our prayers and they need our financial support as well. Part of the money we send to support our denomination does go to mission work both here in our country and in other parts of the world. I am asking once again that you take time, find time, and make time, for your own private, or family devotional worship. Please include *Mission Workers* in your prayers.

Let me share with you the Scripture readings designated for this coming Sunday, May 17th, the Sixth Sunday of Easter:

- Gospel: [John 14:15-21](#)

As before, I encourage you to read one or all of the Scripture texts. I would like to share the message based on Acts 17:22-31. As Paul waited for his companions Silas and Timothy to join him in Athens, Paul was *deeply distressed to see that the city was full of idols* (verse 16). The pantheon of Greek gods and goddesses was well known in the ancient world, and many of the same gods had been adopted and rebranded by the Romans. Most of these gods were linked with some aspect of life such as: romance, reason, war, or even messaging. Religious cults developed around each god or goddess, and their temples were well known across the Roman world. It is important to understand that a person's religious faith is actually shorthand for the lens through which that person sets priorities, focuses on desires, and looks at the rest of the world. Sometimes it is called one's world view. The "*Who*" one worships has a great deal to do with one's world view.

Today, the number of people who declare themselves to be people of no religious faith is on the rise. According to statistics, they accounted for 23.1 percent of the U.S. population in 2019. That reveals an increase from 21.3 percent in 2016. It also means that people who claim no religious faith are statistically tied with Roman Catholic Christians on a percentage basis in the country. If they claim to have no religious faith, in what do they believe? Followers of Jesus Christ do not believe in "*what*". We believe in "*Who*"! This was Paul's message, and it must be ours as well.

For those able to access this technology, I hope you find it meaningful. I sincerely look forward to the day when it is finally safe to welcome you for worship at our Lord's Linway Church.


