

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Friends,

Greetings! I have returned to my desk from personal vacation, and I want to thank the Session and the congregation for my vacation time. I also want to thank the Rev. Dr. Mary Louise Russell for providing worship leadership while I was on vacation. I knew you would be in good hands.

Due to the Corona Virus, my vacation time was spent at home working on my list of projects around our house. I can report that a number of significant projects were accomplished. I can also report that a number of new projects have suddenly appeared as if they have crept up from the bottom as I marked things off at the top. At the moment these new items are on hold. They are not critical, but some things that need my attention when I get around to it. I should have suspected as much.

In my first two Sunday services after my vacation, I used the Joseph Story, found in the Book of Genesis, as the text for my messages. It was the one I was required to translate from the Biblical Hebrew Bible into English when I was in my Seminary training. It has always been meaningful to me.

The Book of Genesis starts with the Creation Stories and God's original plan for humans to be in a relationship with Him in the Garden of Eden. How did that work out? Not well. The humans (Adam and Eve) succumbed to the temptation of sin. They had free choice. They chose poorly. We can understand. We

have all chosen poorly from time to time. But God took what happened and then set about to redeem the situation. Take, for example, the Joseph Story. Joseph's brothers chose to sell him into slavery. They didn't have to do so. Potiphar's wife didn't have to falsely accuse Joseph of taking advantage of her. She chose to do so. God has never stripped humans of free will. And this, I think, is when we see the beautiful sovereignty of God come into play. God can take the sins of the brothers, even the lies of Potiphar's wife, and find a way to redeem them, so that God's ultimate will (salvation and reconciliation) is achieved.

The Joseph Story is a wonderful example of how persistent our heavenly Father is to redeem humanity. Sin cannot upend God's desire and plan to bring us back into a relationship with Him. The sins of the brothers cannot stop the radical display of mercy that God pours out on Jacob's family. God's covenant with Abraham goes through Jacob to be a blessing not only to Jacob's family, but to all the families of the earth. This story reminds us that humanity has not been stripped of free will. God's desire is to redeem us (humanity), in spite of the allure with the things that seek to turn our lives away from Him.

Who could have imagined just one year ago that we would be confronted with the upheaval of the Corona Virus Pandemic? So much has changed! Regular routines and activities have been disrupted. For a while, all we could do is record the reading of a Scripture passage, a prayer, and a message to be made available through Facebook and the church's website. We have then progressed to open worship using the protocols of safety

recommended by the Health Department and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention. I tell you this: **God will not be thwarted by any of this!** Unfortunately, thousands of our fellow Americans and other citizens of the world have died. I believe that they have been received into God's eternal care. I do not believe that this Corona Virus, or anything else that may come along, will deter our heavenly Father from his objective of redeeming humanity. We need only be reminded of what the Apostle Paul wrote:

We are sure that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, not anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 8:38

For those who are comfortable coming to worship, I look forward to seeing you. Out of an abundance of caution, you are asked to continue to wear masks and keep a physical/social distance when you come to worship. For the time being, we will continue to observe worship at the 9:15 a.m. hour with the Scripture, Morning Prayer, and Sermon recorded for broadcast on the church's Facebook page and website. I am thankful beyond words to Rich Cornell & Don Augustin for the hours of effort they continue to put in to make this happen. Please take the opportunity to thank them if you can.

Rally Day will take place on Sunday September 13th. While we may not *rally* in the Linway Sanctuary as in the past, we will *rally* around the Word of God, including the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, which is the Word of God made visible. If you are joining us by way of the broadcast, please be sure to have the elements of bread and juice available for the sacrament and partake as directed.

Please review the information contained in the rest of this newsletter. It can be a great help as we plan our continuing witness. By the grace of God, we are one people and together part of the Body of Christ in this time and place. I look forward to sharing with you the worthy and sacred work of worship, mission, and ministry at our Lord's Linway Church.

The Allegheny County Health Dept. limits indoor gatherings to no more than 25 people but exempted religious organizations from this order. We encourage those who are at high-risk or prefer not to be in public to watch our online video recording of the service on our Facebook page or the church website where it will be posted no later than by Monday at noon.

Flea Market Cancelled: Unfortunately, due to the pandemic, we were unable to hold our annual August Flea Market this year.




Mission to Feed the Homeless




Linway Fall Retreat: Rescheduled to Spring 2021
