MESSAGE FROM OUR STUDENT PASTOR

Dear Beloved Linway Community,

As we step into December and the season of Advent, the words of Psalm 46 feel especially fitting: "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." (Psalm 46:1)

Advent is a season of longing, a season of watching and waiting for God's promised salvation. Yet it arrives at the busiest, noisiest time of year. Our calendars fill, our to-do lists grow, and our minds race faster than ever. In the midst of all this, Scripture calls us back to a holy stillness: "Be still, and know that I am God." (Psalm 46:10)

These words are not spoken into a peaceful setting. Psalm 46 describes a world where the earth trembles, mountains shake, and nations roar. It's a world that feels a lot like ours: a world filled with uncertainty, tension, and deep yearning for peace. And into that world, God speaks a word of assurance: I am with you. I am your refuge. I am your strength.



Advent carries the same promise. We don't prepare for the coming of Christ by pretending the darkness isn't real, we prepare by remembering that God enters the very places where we feel most unsteady. Into our fears, God brings hope. Into our weariness, God brings rest. Into our chaos, God brings peace.

Twice the psalmist repeats the refrain: "The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge." (verses 7 and 11)

This is the heart of Christmas. In Jesus Christ, God becomes truly with us; He is not distant, not abstract, but present and near. The Child in the manger is the living sign that God steps into our story with compassion, courage, and redeeming love.

As we light the candles of hope, peace, joy, and love, we are not simply marking time. We are proclaiming that even in the darkest moments, God's light shines. We are joining generations of believers who have learned to look for God not only in the triumphant moments, but in the quiet, ordinary places where grace shows up.

My prayer for you this month is that you find moments, even if they are small, to pause and breathe in this truth. Light your Advent candle. Sit with a favorite Scripture. Whisper a prayer. Let God's stillness anchor you.

May you know during this holy season that **God is in our midst and will not be moved** (Psalm 46:5). May Christ's peace surround you and steady you. And may the Spirit fill you with hope as we prepare once more to welcome Emmanuel, God with us.

Blessings of hope, peace, joy, and love to you this Advent and Christmas.

He is Wisdom Incarnate, a Shepherd of Souls.


He's the Author of Life; He's the Ruler of All. He can offer salvation, on His name we call. The shepherds and Wise Men would bow to adore
