MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Friends in Christ,

As I write this article I have been at Linway for all of 2 weeks. Your welcome has been a blessing, and I am very much looking forward to knowing you better.

I had a wonderful "informal" meeting with some Session members and got to hear what each of them thought of first when they hear the word "church." Almost all of them said "Linway" and then shared moments of blessing and the people that touched their lives. One thing all agreed upon, Linway sure likes to eat! Perhaps our motto should be, "Till we eat again!" This reminded me of a story I heard years ago. I think it really applies to this new chapter in Linway's story.

A woman knew she had only a short time left to live, and she called her Pastor to make arrangements for her memorial service. She told him which songs she wanted sung at the service, what scriptures she wanted read, and what dress she wanted to be buried in. She also requested to be buried with her Bible in her left hand.

Everything was in order and as the pastor was preparing to leave, the woman suddenly remembered one final request that was very important to her. "Please Pastor, just one more thing", she said excitedly. "Sure, what is it?" came the pastor's reply. "This is very important to me," the woman continued ... "I want to be buried holding a fork in my right hand." The pastor gazed at the woman, with a loss for words. "That surprises you, doesn't it?" the woman asked. The pastor replied "To be quite honest, I'm puzzled by the request."

The women explained. "You see, Pastor, in all my years of attending church socials and potluck dinners, I remember that when the dishes were being cleared after the main course, someone would invariably lean over to me and say, 'Keep your fork'... It was my favorite part because I knew that something better was coming, like velvety chocolate cake or deep dish apple pie---something wonderful, and with substance to end the great meal."

The pastor listened intently and a smile came upon his face. The woman continued, "So, I just want people to see me there with a fork in my hand, and I want them to wonder...'What's with the fork?' I want you to tell them, *"Keep your Fork... The best is yet to come."*

I've only been here at Linway for a brief time, and I still have so much to learn about the people and the ministry of the church, but I can't help but feel that the best days are still ahead! So be sure to **"keep your fork"** as we move forward into the future the Lord holds for us.

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you," declares the LORD." This Maundy Thursday, March 28, we will celebrate the Lord's Supper the way Jesus and the disciples did. They gathered together not in a worship service, but around a table to celebrate the Passover. Everyone is welcome to gather downstairs in our Social Hall at 6:30 p.m. to share a simple meal of soup (chicken noodle or chicken rice soup) and bread. Following the meal, Pastor Larry will share the radical way that Jesus broke all the rules and redefined the Passover so that not only Jews were invited to the table, but all who

would follow Jesus! There is no charge for the meal, but a free will basket will be available should you wish to contribute. Please invite friends, family, youth, and children to join us as we remember and reflect on the first Lord's Supper so many years ago.

Good Friday Tenebrae Service 7:30 p.m.

The Good Friday Tenebrae Service is a solemn service in which we remember Jesus' life, crucifixion, and death. Stemming from Latin, the word "Tenebrae" means "darkness." Such a definition is suitable for this service, which centers around the increasing darkness of the church as the lights on the candelabra are extinguished.

A special candelabra is used during Tenebrae. After each reading, whether from the Psalms or gospels, a candle is extinguished until one is left. By the end of the service, the church is cast into darkness, except for the continual light of the Christ candle, symbolizing Christ as the Light of the World.

As a service with deep biblical meaning, each part of Tenebrae sets the mood for the congregation as they consider the darkness of that day as the Savior hung on the cross and died for the sins of the world. At the conclusion of the service, all who are present exit the sanctuary in silence. Please consider attending this powerful, moving service in person.

If you would like to order a pansies bowl, please place your order as soon as possible since these are very popular and our supplier could run out of the pansies.

March 3: Mr. Bob Jamison

We welcome Bob Jamison who founded Adam's Quest, an outreach to men in the Pittsburgh region who are discovering and pursuing God's plan and purpose for their lives. Since it's founding in 2012, Adam's Quest has grown several unique outreach programs in the region.

Additionally, Bob served as president of Family Guidance, Inc., a ministry to supply mentors and a life-changing camp experience for Pittsburgh's at-risk youth. He also founded TWOgether Pittsburgh, the state's largest marriage-strengthening program.

Bob is co-founder of the Greater Pittsburgh Community Leaders Prayer Breakfast, and currently partners with former Steeler chaplain Hollis Haff in an effort to build a disciple-making movement in our city.

Bob serves in the College of Elders at Mt. Lebanon Evangelical Presbyterian Church. He is the co-author of Steel Faithful: Stories of God at Work in Pittsburgh, 1952-2018.


