A MESSAGE FROM JAKOB



Dear Beloved Linway Community,

As we move through this season together, I've found myself reflecting often on the image of planting and harvesting that runs throughout Scripture. It's one of the most enduring and comforting metaphors God gives us for understanding our shared life of faith. Whether it's the psalmist rejoicing that "those who sow with tears will reap with shouts of joy," or Jesus reminding His disciples that "one sows and another reaps," there's a holy rhythm to this imagery that grounds us in patience, purpose, and trust.

We are, as a congregation, in a season of transition... a word that can sound uncertain, but is also deeply biblical. Every season of God's people is a season of movement: Abraham setting out for a land he did not yet know; the Israelites wandering between Egypt and promise; the disciples following Jesus from village to village without knowing where they'd lay their heads. Transition is not a pause in God's work; it *is* God's work. It's the inbetween space where faith is tested, strengthened, and renewed.

And in this season, I believe God is reminding us that we are called, first and foremost, to sow. It's natural for us to long for visible results. We host and go to events and hope that families will come back. We welcome new faces in worship and pray that they will join the church. We share the love of Christ and hope to see the fruit of transformed lives. When those outcomes don't appear right away (or maybe not at

all), it's easy to feel discouraged, to wonder whether the work we're doing actually matters.

But the truth of the Gospel is that the call to discipleship is not dependent on outcomes. We are not measured by how much we can grow the church, but by how faithfully we love and serve in Christ's name. As Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 3:6–7, "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth."

We are not the gardeners of our own success; we are caretakers of God's kingdom. Sometimes we get to see the harvest. We get to see the pews full, the ministry thriving, the joy overflowing. And sometimes, we simply plant seeds, water the soil, and walk away trusting that God will bring life in His time and in His way. That may sound like a small calling, but it's actually a sacred one. Because without sowers, there can be no harvest. Without those willing to dig into the soil, to get their hands dirty, to scatter the seed even when the ground looks dry; without that quiet, faithful labor, the future cannot take root.

Over the past few months that I've been here, we've had several events that have filled our church grounds with laughter, conversation, and energy. Many of the people who came were not members of our church. Some may never be. They may never fill out a membership form or sit in our pews on Sunday morning. And yet, I believe something holy happened in those moments. When a child laughs on our lawn, when a family feels safe and welcomed here, when a stranger leaves

knowing that someone cared enough to learn their name, that's ministry. That's sowing the seed of the kingdom. Every warm smile, every cup of coffee or chicken dinner shared, every invitation offered with sincerity is a small act of grace, and grace never returns empty.

Isaiah 55:10–11 reminds us of this promise:

"For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it."

Every act of kindness, every prayer spoken, every seed of hope planted in Jesus' name accomplishes something, even if we don't see it. God's word, spoken through our love, is always fruitful in ways beyond our sight.

If you've ever planted a garden, you know that sowing is an act of patience. You can't rush the seed. You can't control the rain or the sun. You prepare the soil, do your part, and then you wait. Sometimes it's weeks or months before you even see a sprout. And even after that time of waiting, it takes more time before fruit begins to appear.

Church life can feel much the same. We work hard to prepare the soil of ministry; we do things like planning programs, praying for renewal, and investing in relationships. But it can take time, sometimes a long time, before the fruit becomes visible. And yet, even in that waiting, God is at work. Below the surface, unseen by human eyes, the seed is germinating. Roots are taking hold.

New life is being prepared. We may not always recognize it, but the Spirit is always moving in ways we can't measure.

Faithful ministry requires that kind of patience...and that kind of trust, too. Trust that what we do in the name of Christ has value even if it doesn't produce immediate growth. Trust that God's timeline is not our own. Trust that sowing in faith today will lead, in God's good time, to a harvest we may never see but others will rejoice in.

Our congregation is living in a unique moment. We are continually discerning who we are, who we are becoming, and what God is calling us to do in this community. Transitions can feel uncertain, but they are also times of incredible opportunity; opportunity because God often does His best work in the soil of change. So I encourage you: this is the time to keep sowing. The time to keep showing up, keep praying, keep giving, keep serving. The seeds we plant now, in faith, will become the foundation for the next season of this church's ministry.

We might not be the ones to see the harvest, but someone will. Another generation of believers may one day worship in this sanctuary, their faith strengthened by the roots we planted today. The children who came to our events this year may one day remember this place as a place where they felt loved and safe. The family who visited only once may remember your kindness as the moment they first glimpsed the heart of Christ. That's what it means to live as a sowing people; we trust that our labor, offered in love, is never wasted.

Friends, the temptation in ministry (both for pastors and congregations) is to measure success in numbers, outcomes, and results. But the kingdom of God is measured differently. It's measured in love, in faithfulness, in the willingness to do the small, steady work of sowing

seeds and trusting that God will bring the growth.

So, again, I want to encourage you: keep sowing. Keep showing up to worship, even when you're tired. Keep reaching out to your neighbors, even if they don't come on Sunday. Keep praying for this church and for one another. Keep trusting that what you do in Christ's name is never in vain. Paul reminds us in Galatians 6:9. "Let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up." That's the promise that carries us through. We may not yet see the full picture of what God is doing, but we can trust that the Spirit is already at work, turning our faithfulness into fruit.

As I look out over our congregation each Sunday, I see people who have been faithful sowers for many years. I see those who have prayed, served, given, and loved through every season; I see those who know that ministry is not about quick results, but about lifelong faithfulness. You are the reason this church continues to shine as a light in this community.

So as we continue in this time of transition, let's remember who we are: a people called to sow. Called to plant seeds of love, hope, and grace in every heart we encounter. Called to trust that God is doing something new, even when we can't yet see it. Called to believe that the harvest will come, in God's time, and to God's glory. May we find joy in the sowing, hope in the waiting, and peace in the promise that God's word never returns empty.



We'll then take the donated items and fill more shoeboxes!
