provide pastoral care. Pastor Jakob has a
deep passion for preaching, teaching, and
nurturing faith through word and song.
Originally from rural Oklahoma, Jakob grew
up closely connected to his family and local
church community. Though he sensed a
call to ministry early in life, he first pursued
a career in music education, spending
seven years in various education and
leadership capacities before responding to
God's call to ministry.

Pastor Jakob holds an Associate of Arts from Rose State College and a Bachelor's in Music Education from the University of Central Oklahoma. He is currently completing his final year at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary, where he is preparing for ordained ministry in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). After seminary, Jakob is planning to obtain a PhD. in Biblical Studies, with an emphasis in the New Testament.

Jakob has served in various ministry roles; from youth leadership and worship music in his home church to preaching, teaching, and youth ministry at Cross Roads Presbyterian Church in Monroeville. He is particularly passionate about preaching the Word of God with clarity and compassion, developing the next generation of Christian leaders, and weaving music into the life of worship.

In his free time, Jakob enjoys hiking, camping, stargazing, songwriting, and learning new instruments. He is thrilled to be serving as Student Pastor at Linway and

looks forward to seeing how God will move through the church's gifts and passions in the community and beyond.

Living Into Our Purpose

Dear Friends in Christ,

At Linway, we are guided by a simple and powerful purpose: "to joyfully worship and serve the mission and ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ." That sentence says so much about who we are and what God calls us to do. It keeps us grounded, especially in times like these when so much around us feels like it is in transition.

Fall is always a season of change. Children and teachers return to classrooms. Families adjust to new routines. Days grow shorter, the weather cools, and we begin to sense the rhythm of the year turning toward something new. Here at Linway, we also feel the winds of transition as we continue our search for a full-time pastor. In the midst of all this change, it can be easy to feel uncertain or even restless. And yet, our purpose remains the same.

We are called first to worship joyfully. Worship is not something we do out of habit or duty, but out of gratitude for the God who created us, redeemed us in Christ, and sustains us day by day with His Holy Spirit. When we gather in worship, we remember that God is at the center of our

life together. We remember that no matter what else changes, the steadfast love of the Lord never does. Worship roots us in what is eternal and lifts our eyes to the hope of Christ.

We are also called to serve the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ. That mission is not something we invent for ourselves; it is something Christ entrusts to us. It is the work of loving our neighbors, welcoming the stranger, feeding the hungry, encouraging the weary, and proclaiming good news to the world. When we serve, we are reminded that the church is not just a building or a Sunday morning gathering; it is a living witness to the presence of Christ in our community.

Transitions remind us that the church is not built on any one pastor or leader, but on Jesus Christ, the one foundation that never shifts. Pastors come and go, programs adapt, and even traditions sometimes evolve, but our purpose does not. It is Christ's mission that carries us forward, and it is our joy in worship and service that makes us who we are.

As we enter this new season, my prayer is that we keep leaning into this purpose together. Let us gather with joy, even when the world feels heavy. Let us serve with hope, even when the needs around us feel overwhelming. Let us remain steady in faith, trusting that God is not finished with Linway, but is already preparing the way for new opportunities and new growth.

I am deeply grateful to be walking with you in this season of change. God has been faithful to this congregation for many generations, and I believe God will continue to be faithful in the days ahead. May we continue to live with joy, serve with love, and trust in the Lord Jesus Christ who leads us forward.

- -New participants welcome! Bring a friend! You do not need to have watched the prior seasons to join in the Bible study. Each discussion stands on its own and is more about God's message to us in his Word than the episode itself.
